When asked what kind of armament they had on board, he answered an emphatic NONE. His type of aircraft was for transporting troops and supplies, mostly the latter. They were never intentionally sent into a combat area. Herb related one time that they discovered a Japanese Zero 'hiding' under their tail. He never did anything, so they figured that he was lost and using Herb's aircraft as a quide.
