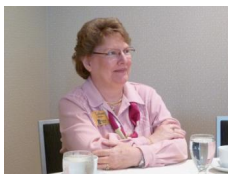
Circle of Service

He spoke to the club updating scams and schemes that are being used in the country with emphasis on what he sees as a representative of the Rochester Police Dept.

Darryl has spoken to us before, so we were ready for some of the warnings he always brings. He passed out a sheet with a list of frauds, scams and ID thefts. He assembles an update each 2 months. He lists the numbers of each type of event. His numbers show that 400 more incidents were reported than last year. Part of that is the addition of 'Porch Pirates.' I won't list the categories due to the length of



the list. Suffice it to say, stay alert and wallets or purses protected at all times. Use your head and don't be a victim.
