# Jim Bier

Is a current chairman of Olmsted County Commission? Jim was first elected in 2002. His style of presentation was good for our club. He took about 10 minutes outlining what he

oversees in his position and then opened up for Q&A. That took the rest of the hour. Jim says some of their primary duties are: Overseeing the jail system, the Sheriff's Dept., takes care of the 'Waste to Energy' program, "Welfare Administrator for the county. There are more duties, but these were the biggies.

He stressed that there are no property tax dollars in the Waste to Energy system. Fees come from the collection of garbage and the selling of steam for A/C and heating to many downtown businesses. Comments on Seneca property; the County will close at the end of June on the purchase of the old Seneca plant and a lot of the attached property. I'm not clear on the amount of the property, but it was interesting to hear Jim say that one of his dreams for some of that property would be to have a massive parking area with a continuously running shuttle service to downtown. We'll see....

It was a good program for all of us to hear.
