An amazing 2 letter English word.

A reminder that one word in the English language that can be a noun, verb, adjective, adverb and preposition.

To be knowledgeable about the proper uses of $(\underline{UP}, \operatorname{look} (\underline{UP} + \operatorname{the word} (\underline{UP} + \operatorname{in} + \operatorname{the dictionary}))$ in a desk-sized dictionary, it takes $(\underline{UP} + \operatorname{almost} 1/4)$ of the page and can add $(\underline{UP} + \operatorname{to} + \operatorname{about} + \operatorname{thirty} + \operatorname{definitions})$.
